Letter from the Executive Director

Dear Friends,

Once again I need to make a plea for your financial support. We are in great need of funds to support our stay here. In addition to the cost of staff we continue to struggle to pay for our monthly rent, insurance premiums and utilities.

Our 2016-2017 season officially came to a close on the morning of April 16th. We had a significant number of guests this season, 176, and we were at capacity almost every night. We had to make use of the overflow site at the United Church of Christ every night between January 2 and March 31, 2017, and honestly we could have continued making use of the overflow right up until April 16th. This necessitated hiring another paid staff member to assist the volunteer provided by the church for overnight supervision. A total of 4,792 bed-night of shelter has been provided since July 1, 2016. Due to the lack of space at the SCS Women and Family Shelter we were needed to house 8 families with a total of 15 children over the course of this last season. That made our space feel even tighter. Fire codes allow us to house only 26 overnight guests here on Lamson St. and up to 16 at the United Church of Christ (although their preferred number is 10). Hence once we meet that number each night we face the possibility of turning people away. At this date we still have two families with four children combined staying here even though our shelter season has officially closed, and one family with three children just left. We are working diligently with both families to find a solution for them. If you know of any available affordable housing or of anyone willing to help these families please let us know.

High numbers and high rent combined with cramped quarters led us on a search for a larger space. We spent almost a year looking at various sites and thought we had found the perfect location on Vernon/Washington Streets. We applied to the City for a variance to obtain a lodging license. We also applied for tax credits from the NH Community Development Finance Authority in the amount of \$430,000. Unfortunately the Zoning Board denied our request for a variance, which also means that we cannot get the tax credits. The NH CDFA, however, has told us that our proposal was highly rated and that if we can find a suitable building for our relocation project that we would have a very strong proposal going in to the March, 2018 round of tax credit funding. While it was most disappointing to not receive the variance we continue with our endeavor to find suitable larger quarters. If you know of a building or piece of land in Keene that might lend itself to being our new home, please let us know.

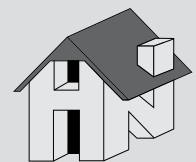
We are hoping to get together with the City Council, the Mayor and others and have a Community Forum on Homelessness. Our ultimate hope is that together we all can reach a solution to not only where Hundred Nights should live, but also come to a better understanding of our combined responsibilities regarding outreach to the homeless.

I have tried very hard to only ask for special assistance when it is most needed. I hope that you will call me if you have any questions at all about our financial or other situations, and that you will please consider our request for financial support at this time.

I felt an overwhelming feeling of love and respect for all of them. I began to see the goodness, strength and courage in them. I went home that night knowing that I was blessed by knowing these beautiful people. What a gift I was given that first night! Sure they are perhaps a little ragged around the edges and some act rough and tough but inside that rough exterior is a living, breathing human being who has value just like the rest of us. I have just finished being an intake volunteer for the 2016-2017 Cold Weather season. This season I worked two nights a week. Will I be back next season? You bet I will!

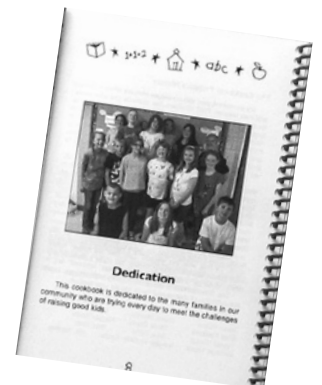

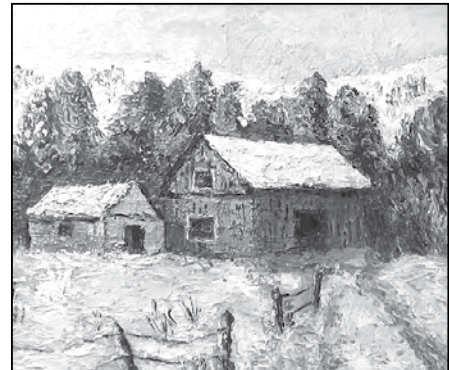
