
FEDERAL POVERTY LINE (FPL) 2018

Retired Senior Citizen

In February, local Police asked us to help Joe, a 68 year- old man who found himself suddenly out in the cold. Joe called the Police since he knew nothing about homeless services in the area and they brought him to Hundred Nights. Joe stayed with us for seven weeks until he could get an affordable apartment, given his limited income. In addition to HN's help, Joe received assistance from SCS, Keene Housing, Cheshire Housing Trust, Service Link, and The Community Kitchen.

David is a welder and came to the area with a contract to work on wind turbines. He stayed with his brother, in Keene, while sending money home to his spouse and two sons in Florida. Just as his welding contract ended, Hurricane Irma wiped out their Florida home and belongings. Liz, who was pregnant at the time, and the kids relocated to Keene; however, the family could not live long with David's brother due to his lease. They came to Hundred Nights for shelter. While there, Liz & David worked different shifts at a restaurant, saving every penny for 3 weeks. With help from HN and Southwestern Community Services David, Liz and children now have their own apartment. David is working in his field, and the family, including a baby sister, can now give back to the community that showed them kindness.

Couple Needed Help to Return Home

Tracy & Tyler left their jobs and home in Florida to come to Keene to care for dying parents. After their deaths, Tracy & Tyler found themselves stranded in Keene. Tyler stayed at SCS Men's Shelter while Tracy couch-surfed. They asked Hundred Nights for assistance in getting home. HN staff reached out to Keene's Human Services, St. James Church, The Community Kitchen and Catholic Charities. Working together, bus tickets, backpacks and snacks for the long ride were provided. Tracy and Tyler are happy to be home again in Florida, with friends and family.



Casper and Rosemary

Rosemary was hospitalized in January. While there her oil ran out and the pipes burst, flooding the house and making it uninhabitable. Suddenly homeless, she came to Hundred Nights for help and stayed until her dilemma could be resolved. Her cat, Casper, also needed care and a "Friend of Hundred Nights" fostered him. HN connected Rosemary with other agencies and programs that might help her, including SCS, Legal Aid, Elderly Services, and DHHS for SNAP and Medicaid. HN also provided transportation and paperwork assistance while looking for a solution. Rosemary made the decision to sell her house and move to an affordable apartment. Finally, in July, she and Casper happily moved to their own apartment.
